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Checking In: Whiteface Lodge radiates Olympic enthusiasm

Ski, skate, shoot and slide where champions competed in Lake Placid Let the Games begin.

Let the Games begin.

We're rooting fervently for our talented Canadian athletes to make it to the podium at the Sochi Olympics, Feb. 7-23, and our hopes and dreams are especially with such Quebecers as Alpine skiers Erik Guay and Alexandre Bilodeau, speedskater Charles Hamelin and the mogulbashing sisters Maxime, Chloé and Justine Dufour-Lapointe.

But, travel-wise, no town in the northeast embodies the spirit of the Winter Olympics like Lake Placid, N.Y., at the heart of the Adirondack Mountains and the only venue in North America to have held two snow Games, in 1932 and 1980. Lake Placid radiates Olympic enthusiasm year-round, but the excitement is at its peak this month with Olympic flags flying on Main St. and local businesses holding promotions and contests.

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Whiteface Lodge was conceived and built by Olympic luger Joe Barile, and today one of its employees, Chris Mazdzer, is in Sochi, set to compete in the same sport.

Whiteface Lodge is a handsome, luxurious all-suite resort overlooking downtown Lake Placid. It's not even 10 years old, but it has a classic, sturdy design of timber and fieldstone that recalls the Adirondack Great Camps.

The hotel looks rustic but it's thoroughly modern and fully loaded for vacation life. It has 94 spacious one-, two- and three-bedroom suites with designer kitchens, washer-dryers, flat-screen TVs in all the rooms, custom furniture and cabinetry, bathrooms with jet tubs, double vanities and heated floors, and private balconies with mountain views.

Whiteface Lodge is a top-drawer property, with spa life and dining to match. The signature treatment at The Spa at Whiteface Lodge is the Purifying Lodge Retreat featuring a body wrap and hot stone massage. KANU — it uses all-caps spelling for emphasis — is a stunning dining room with a magnificent fireplace and hand-hewn décor. The hearty American gastronomy includes pumpkin bisque with maple syrup and chanterelles and braised venison shank with red currant and white bean purée. The more casual KANU Lounge features such gourmet family fare as a cheddar burger and fries with truffle oil and crispy duck bacon.

Because of the home-away-from-home accommodations, Whiteface Lodge is ideal for families. Kids love the indoor-outdoor-heated pool and the nighttime family bonfires with s'mores. There are luxury lean-tos that I thought would be great hideouts for youngsters, but they're more used by grown-ups as unusual lounges for cocktails and hors d'oeuvres or cigars and cognac.

With competition-calibre facilities still in place for luge, bobsled, biathlon, Nordic skiing and downhill at Whiteface Mountain, visitors can strive to be citius, altius, fortius, (the Olympic motto — faster, higher, stronger — in Latin), even if they're only are weekend athletes.

One of my favourite excursions is the Ladies' 5-K Nordic trail at Mt. Van Hoevenberg, a pastoral five-kilometre trail through thick woods and up and down hills. I'm considerably more plodding than the world-class competitors whose ski time for five kilometres is an astounding 16 minutes or so, but it's a thrill to ski where champions have raced. Later, you can channel your inner hunter and simulate a biathlon with a coaching session at the target range. You'll be up close and personal with a 22-calibre rifle aiming for a bulls-eye that is 50 metres away.

The Olympic Skating Oval on Lake Placid's Main St. is open to the public and this is a delightful activity that is both exhilarating and social. You can skate laps to music and follow with hot chocolate.

You need a truly adventurous spirit to brave Lake Placid's bobsled ride. A driver and brakeman escort you on the five-passenger sled as you rocket down a narrow, icy track at almost 100 kilometres per hour for an explosive 50 seconds. It is so fast that you actually feel a G-force tug, but world champions reach a daunting 140 km/h. You won't catch me bobsledding, thank you very much, but I always love a visit to the Lake Placid Olympic Museum on Main St. That's a lot tamer.


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I've saved the best-known for last. Whiteface Mountain Ski Center was an ideal Olympic venue in 1980 because it has the longest vertical drop in eastern North America (1,018 metres/3,340 feet), easily fulfilling the 914-metre (3,000-foot) minimum requirement for some of the ski competitions. (Whiteface wasn't part of the 1932 action because the first Olympic downhill events were the combined men's and women's races at the 1936 Games in Garmisch, Germany.)

At Whitefacem you can conquer the steep, mogul trails that were part of the Games 20-plus years ago, but now you'll be gliding up on highspeed lifts. Even with those rugged expert runs, Whiteface maintains a strong folksy, family side. In recent years, it has opened Lookout Mountain and expanded its glades. The hot new trail through the trees is the black-diamond Rand's Last Stand. Whiteface also has added considerable snow-making and grooming systems.

Lake Placid is a two-hour drive from Montreal. Take Highway 15 south and New York Highway 87 south to Exit 34.

The Ultimate Winter Escape: Whiteface Lodge

Snowstorms do not translate to cabin fever at the Whiteface Lodge in Lake Placid, New York. On a recent stay during the holidays, the

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94-room Adirondack resort, made up of one-, two- and threebedroom suites and duplexes with fully equipped kitchens, proved the place to be when temperatures fall below zero at night and run in the single digits during the day.

Despite the town's numerous offerings—everything from bobsledding on a World Cup track to ice-skating on an Olympic oval to dogsledding on Mirror Lake, not to mention downhill and crosscountry skiing-time spent at the lodge can be as adventurous or as relaxing as one wants it to be. Skipping the complimentary fiveminute shuttle service into the village, we opted for a morning "yogalates" class (a combination of yoga, Pilates and body resistance training) on a terrace overlooking snow-capped mountains. Afterward we plunged into the 87-degree pool with its massive, 104-degree hot tub, steam rising up into the five-degree air outside. (The lodge has an underground passageway to the pool, which is partly indoors, so there's no need to freeze getting in and out of it.)

An 80-minute deep-tissue massage (\$180) at the recently enhanced spa, with its new Spa Café and hair salon, prepared us for a cozy retreat to our suite for some downtime by the fireplace. The spa's menu of services features HydraFacial MD facials (from \$125 for 25 minutes), which we recently experienced and highly recommend as a quick and effective way to deeply cleanse and intensely hydrate skin. The take-home kit (available with the purchase of a sixtreatment series) helps the detoxifying and rejuvenating effects last even longer.

Dinner at restaurant KANU consisted of oxtail soup and wild-boar stew cooked to perfection, plus a dessert of homemade ice-creamcookie sandwiches topped with fudge and whipped cream. Drinks in the KANU lounge, where entertaining local musicians played, closed out the day. And there was even the option of watching the film Avatar that evening in the resort's movie theater, located next to the old-fashioned arcade. (Earlier in the day it screened Madagascar 3 and Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban to keep the kids entertained.)

There is no doubt plenty to do at Whiteface. But one of the best parts of staying at the lodge is the comfortable at-home feel you get from the beautifully rustic Adirondack Great Camp decor and the exceptional, welcoming service. Here, everyone knows your name. Rooms start at \$375; 7 Whiteface Inn Ln.; 518-523-0500; thewhitefacelodge.com.

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

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

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

10 of the Best Writing Retreats






In idyllic environments – far away from the demands and routines of everyday life – each offers the opportunity to relax and hone your craft. So why not pack your manuscript and your pajamas and treat yourself to a few blissful days of writing in one of these inspirational settings?

- 1. Whiteface Lodge, Lake Placid, USA Pine beams, cast-iron fireplaces and six million acres of mountainous parkland, the rustic and incredibly cozy Whiteface Lodge in New York State is the perfect place to pitch your laptop for a week or two. Each suite boasts a full kitchen, a writing desk and a seriously stunning view or, if you prefer a little people watching while you write, you can work in the downstairs lounge by the fireplace. Once you've logged your daily word count, there are plenty of opportunities for skiing, skating, bobsledding, fishing and canoeing, and the 5,800-square-foot spa offers "a heaven-sent four-handed massage". - **2. Farncombe Estate, Cotswolds, UK** Set within 400 acres of private grounds, Farncombe Estate, located in the Cotswolds countryside, offers a wealth of one-day and residential writing courses led by experienced tutors. Options include Finding Your Voice and Novel Outline in a Weekend.
- **3. Watermill, Posara, Italy** Sun-drenched Italian courtyards, plenty of hearty Tuscan fare and tutorage from bestselling authors are all key ingredients of the writing retreats at The Watermill in Italy. Visit in May and enjoy a week-long romance writing course with Sharon Kendrick, who has written more than 90 books for Harlequin Mills & Boon and is a USA TODAY bestseller. Or, if you fancy yourself as more of an Agatha Christie type, stay in October for lessons with award-winning thriller author, Meg Gardiner. All meals at the restored 17th century mill are provided, so all you have to do is write. Absolute bliss.
 - 4. Auberge Nordique, French Alps, France If scenic walks and plenty of fresh air inspire you to put words to the page, the Auberge Nordique retreat in the French alpine village of Le Grand-Bornand is definitely for you. Itineraries are a blend of writing sessions and mountainous 'literary' hikes, which are

overlooking Cardigan Bay in Wales, meanwhile, will play host to a packed schedule of writing courses this year. Scriptwriting, storytelling, short fiction, literary novels and crime writing are just some of the study options offered by Literature Wales with funding and bursaries available to lower income writers.

- **6. The Writer's Lab, Skyros, Greece** Meals of fresh fruit, yogurt and whole grains, accommodation in charmingly traditional Greek townhouses and lessons from Booker and Pulitzer Prize winners, The Writer's Lab on the ancient island of Skyros has it all. Start your day with breakfast and some gentle yoga on the sunny terrace before morning courses begin. The afternoons are left free for sun-worship, sightseeing or more writing if you're so inclined.
- **7. The Grange by the Sea, Isle of Wight, UK** For a creative island experience a little closer to home, the gorgeous Grange country hotel on the Isle of Wight offers year-round writing courses, which are led by experienced tutors. You can choose from The Art of Writing Fiction, Writing for the Screen of Your Voice among others.
- 8. Creative Adventures, Morocco Mint tea, mules and Moroccan markets, this five-day itinerary places lots of emphasis on fueling your imagination with lots of excursions into the vibrant, buzzing city of Marrakech. Don't be fooled, though; there's plenty of work to be done, too. You'll cover everything from story plotting and structure to tightening your prose and pitching to agents.



9. Literary Adventures, Las Alpujarras, Spain -

The 400 year old Spanish house Casa Ana plays host to this inspiring autumnal week long writing retreat. Led by award-winning author, journalist and creative writing tutor Rebecca Abrams in October, writing exercises and sessions are sandwiched between guest speakers, one-on-one tutorage and excursions to neighbouring towns for meals and shopping.

10. Arvon, Various, UK – Creative writing foundation Arvon has been giving people the time and space to write since 1968. The foundation's four rural retreats, including Lumb Bank in Yorkshire – former home of Ted Hughes, offer a beautiful setting for expert tuition from knowledgeable authors. Thanks to the support of Arts Council England and generous donors, Arvon offers grants to cover some or all of attendees' course fees, too.

Back in 1980, the U.S. ice hockey team beat the Russians when the winter Olympic Games were held at Lake Placid, New York.

As excitement builds for this winter's Olympic Games in Russia, the place to enjoy the action is Lake Placid's Olympic Park.

Twice host for the winter Olympics, Lake Placid is the opposite of Sochi when it comes to crowds. Small hotels, boutiques, and burger shops line the lakeshore leading to the Olympic Park. Set in the magnificent Adirondack State Park, the combination of sport and spa has never been better. There are thrilling rides on the Olympic luge, and the gondola to Whiteface Mountain's ski complex. Avid skiers can hit the slopes on 86 trails spanning 22 miles of exhilarating terrain.

The perfect place to watch the Sochi games in comfort, Lake Placid's Whiteface Lodge has a full-service spa as well as indoor swimming pool, and open-air ice skating rink. Lodge guests will be treated to excursions and events throughout the area.

Tucked into a nine-room sanctuary, the spa has hair and nail salons, offers a wide range of treatments plus group exerise, fitness equipment, and a healthy option cafe. Massive logs frame the main dining room, Kanu. Stone fireplaces warm the room, and a wood-fired oven produces regional specialties as well as pizza. The farm-to-table menu created by executive chef David Haick and his team is sourced from local farms. During my visit last fall we were impressed by a bone-in beef tenderloin, butternut squash puree on toasted chanterelle mushrooms, baked Scotch egg with salad, and hay-smoked Nova Scotia oysters. Dessert was apple sorbet, with wines and beer from New York.

Ideal for families, the Lodge has a kitchen in every suite. With just 94 spacious suites spread on


three floors, the central garden has an ice skating rink and indoor/outdoor swimming pools. The spa's underground location provides a warm walkway to the pools, which aren't large enough for swimming laps but keep kids happy. And there's a 56-seat movie theater for daily screenings, complete with popcorn.

As night came on, couples relaxed in the whirlpools, steam rising into the crisp air. The Adirondacks are about enjoying the outdoors, and cross-country ski trails on the Lodge grounds add an element of exercise. Some guests settle into open-air huts with snacks from room service. Two spacious, hand-crafted lean-tos provide an inviting, sheltered spot under the stars to gather for cigars, whiskey flights, and hors d'oeuvres by the fire.

Whiteface Lodge has daily rates that include breakfast buffet and use of spa facilities. The Olympic Experience Package includes a special Olympic-themed welcome amenity, two 50-minute sports massages, and two Olympic Sites Passports offering admission to the Lake Placid Olympic Museum and Ski Jumping Complex among other popular attractions. Whiteface Lodge's concierge team will also be on hand as expert "coaches" to help guests go for the gold in events including ice-climbing, bobsledding, tubing, speed skating, and downhill skiing at nearby Whiteface Mountain.


Boston, MA:



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

Beyond cedar wood saunas and eucalyptus steam rooms, its heated pool is partly enclosed by floor-to-ceiling windows, and partly open-air. A \$135 50-minute massage might be a small splurge, but the \$230 half-day package of two treatments and a spa lunch is a

blissful deal.

Strawberry Park Hot Springs

Steamboat Springs, CO

A muscle-melting soak makes it that much easier to enjoy the snow-capped mountains of Colorado. If you're skiing in Steamboat Springs, the mineral hot springs (ranging from a comfortably cool to scalding hot) are just a 20-minute drive and a \$10 entrance fee away. For ultimate relaxation, spring for a massage, starting at \$50 for a half-hour. Or, to make the most of your getaway, stay overnight in a rustic wagon, cabin, or train caboose (from \$60). Note: The pools are clothing-optional after dark.

Juvenex

New York, NY

City sightseers might be surprised to find a veritable sanctuary smack dab in NYC's Koreatown that's known for its intensely thorough scrubs. Juvenex's beloved "Jade Journey," (\$65 a la carte or \$35 with any service), is a pilgrimage to bliss that starts with an "igloo" sauna, aromatherapy steam room, and invigorating rainforest shower. Then, sink into tubs infused with sake, algae, and other enhancements, then go zen in a warm clay sauna. It's not five-star hotel sleek, but it's certainly a serene step up from the city's budget bathhouses.

G2O Spa & Salon

Boston, MA

Steam, schmeam. In the middle of Boston's bustling Newbury Street, the amenities at this modern-minded respite go far beyond the basic. A brine "inhalation room" with enhanced "salt air" encourages you to literally breathe some life back into your body, and the skylight hot tub is calming whether it's a sunny day or a starry night. There's even a lightly scented nap pod for a little restorative rest, free to use for 20 minutes with any service. A half-hour targeted massage goes for \$75, and a 60-minute deep tissue massage is \$115.

<u>Amara Resort & Spa</u>

Sedona, AZ

For a truly transformative experience, nothing beats the mystical energies of Sedona. Tap into the power of the elements at the Amara Resort & Spa – a Kimpton property – with a balancing grape seed scrub, detoxifying seaweed wrap, or clarifying papaya facial (\$120 for 60 minutes or \$180 for 90 minutes). After your treatment, hit the steam room or do a few laps in the heated infinity pool, all set against blazing red rock views.

Allyu

Chicago, IL

A day at Allyu means South Asian treatments like chakra balancing, reiki, and aromatherapy, alongside stress-busting Shiatsu technique. Though the high-tech, super-hot infrared sauna comes with a \$25 price tag, it includes complimentary use of a personal rainshower with refreshing herbal amenities. But most otherworldly of all is the Moroccan-style relaxation tent, a cocoon of glowing light, gauzy curtains, and slouchy sofas.

Ojo Caliente

Santa Fe, NM

This Navajo-inspired resort offers something a little different – with fees that are a little easier to manage – in Santa Fe. Eleven (!) hot springs brim with four different types of thermal mineral waters... on top of a new detoxifying mud pool and steam and sauna rooms. Unlimited access is complimentary with treatments over \$100, and while a \$109, 50-minute deep tissue massage qualifies, the \$130, 75-minute combo of a custom massage plus a blue corn and prickly pear scrub sure sounds like Southwestern heaven.

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

The Mirror Lake Inn's swoon-worthy Colonial House rooms, complete with fireplaces, whirlpool tubs, and balconies, are the perfect landing spot for honeymooners. Active couples will find plenty to love at the Whiteface Lodge, where canoeing, kayaking, volleyball, horseshoes, bocce, and paddleboarding—on a private beach, no less—are just a shuttle ride away.

What to Do

Adirondack Park boasts six million acres of lakes and mountains—ride the Cloudsplitter Gondola to the top of Little Whiteface to see some of them. 



Organic, farm-to-table cuisine is served at Artisans restaurant and back in your cabin at the end of the day, fall into your featherbed for sweet dreams.

WHITEFACE LODGE

A mile from Lake Placid village, this 94-suite timberand-stone lodge is the perfect place to immerse yourself in outdoor adventures. On property, ice skating and cross-country skiing are offered and when you're ready for downhill skiing, Whiteface Mountain is about 20 minutes away. There are 87 trails on 288 acres of terrain with runs for all levels from gentle cruisers to double black diamonds that many pros have schussed down.

Back at the resort, soothe sore muscles with an alfresco soak in the outdoor hot tub or indulge in a hot stone massage in the spa. Kids will get a kick out of the twolane bowling alley and the 56-seat movie theater. THE POINT

For a truly splurge-worthy winter getaway, there's the Point, a secluded lodge once owned by the Rockefeller family and now a super-private retreat. Nestled along the Adirondacks' Upper Saranac Lake, just a few miles from Lake Placid, the Point is a throwback to the elegant Great Camp era. The 11 rustic-chic rooms are spread among four timber and stone cabins and feature comforts like woodburning fireplaces and claw-foot tubs.

Spend the days snowshoeing along peaceful pine forest trails, ice skate across the frozen lake or try your hand at curling. Afterward, staff will deliver a hot chocolate or hot toddy directly to the outdoor bonfire area set up with Adirondack chairs topped with wool blankets. There's communal fireside dining in the Great Hall—black tie is suggested on select nights—creating a festive, house-party atmosphere.

Enjoy pink Champagne and hors d'oeuvres followed by a three-course gourmet dinner (perhaps Maine lobster and filet mignon) with wine from the well-stocked cellar. Those who still have energy can play a game of pool and darts in the cozy little pub across from the main house.

HOW ART CURATES PROFIT ROOM SERVICE SONGOWE EVOLUTION THE INTERVIEW: KIT AND TIM KEMP GETS,COZY

Herb N' Kitchen at New York Hilton Midtown aims to offer reasonably priced, high-quality food in an engaging environment as an alternative to traditional room service.



Although not intended to replace traditional room service, Louvre Hotels Group's new Grab & Go concept is expected to increase F&B turnover 10% to 15%.

UP FOR GRARS

The launch of Herb N' Kitchen at New York Hilton Midtown last fall was more than a standard restaurant debut. For many, it marked a seismic shift in the room service landscape as the hotel moved away from traditional in-room dining to emphasize this casual grab-and-go concept, which also offers in-room delivery to hotel quests. The menu features many local favorites at relatively low price points - the Pat La Frieda Cheeseburger (USS9.75), for instance, and fish n' chips battered with Brooklyn Lager (US\$13.75).

"The Herb N' Kitchen concept was built to provide guests what they are looking for - reasonably priced, high-quality meals on the go in a destination that is engaging and allows for customization," says Beth Scott, vice president, global product development -F&B, wellness and restaurant concepts, Hilton Worldwide.

Although Scott declines to disclose numbers related to Herb N' Kitchen's business performance, she says the outlet has been well received by guests, not to mention providing operations benefits. The self-service and flexible model allows the space to easily transition throughout the day with a variety of options including liveaction stations and made-to-order or premade dishes," Scott says.

The concept they created at the Hilton Midtown is fantastic." enthuses Corey Nyman, director of operations at Las Vegas-based consultancy The Nyman Group. "The food and beverage society we're in now would much rather have an a la carte experience than have to wait 20, 40 or 60 minutes for delivery of a meal, pay a service charge to get it up to the room, a mandatory gratuity on top of that and taxes."

Scott notes traditional room service remains important for many Hilton properties, but there is no denying the grab-and-go alternative is gaining ground. In January, Louvre Hotels Group introduced Grab & Go. a self-service F&B area designed to round out its overall F&B offerings, at select hotels in France. Whiteface Lodge in Lake Placid, New York, opened Bear's Den Market, which serves house-made pastries and sandwiches in addition to gifts and convenience items 24/7, last fall.

Resort at Squaw Creek in Olympic Valley, California, serves all room service orders out of its deli to give quests more options for customization and make operations as efficient as possible. "Guests can walk into the deli and see the quality of the food before they order," says Squaw Creek Resort Manager Andre Priemer. "Guests can order takeaway or delivery from the full deli menu. By taking advantage of a food outlet that was already open, we were able to streamline the costs associated with room service, and as a result both lunch and dinner room service have become profitable."
